DANIEL D. BLINKA is a Professor of Law at the Marquette University Law School. He has been a member of the faculty since 1985 and before that was an Assistant District Attorney for Milwaukee County. At Marquette he teaches courses in Evidence, Trial Advocacy, and Criminal Law and Procedure. Among his many publications is the highly regarded *Wisconsin Evidence*, which is regularly cited as authority by the Wisconsin appellate courts. He is a frequent speaker at continuing legal education programs for judges and lawyers on the subject of evidence law. Professor Blinka holds both a Juris Doctor degree and a Ph.D. in History from the University of Wisconsin.

JOHN CHISHOLM is a Senior Lecturer at the Marquette University Law School. He joined the Law School faculty following a 30-year career as a prosecutor. From 2007 to 2025 he was the elected District Attorney for Milwaukee County. Among other things Mr. Chisholm served on the Executive Board for the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, the Institute for Innovation at John Jay College, and the Wisconsin State Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. He is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School.

CHRISTOPHER MUTSCHLER is a veteran practitioner of motor vehicle law and currently works in an of counsel relationship with the DUI defense firm of Melowski and Singh in Sheboygan, Wisconsin. He is among the authors of the treatise *Traffic Law and Practice in Wisconsin* published by the State Bar of Wisconsin and has been a frequent speaker on matters relating to the defense of traffic cases. Mr. Mutschler is a graduate of the Marquette University Law School.

DAVORIN ODRICIC is an immigration lawyer based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and has been practicing immigration law since 2006. He has participated in authoring numerous publications dealing with immigration issues and was the original author of *Consequences of Wisconsin Criminal Offenses* published by the State Bar of Wisconsin. He is a frequent speaker on immigration at local, state and national conferences and has been a faculty member at the Immigration Court Trial Advocacy College in Kansas City, Missouri since 2021. Mr. Odricic is a graduate of the University of Notre Dame Law School.

TIMOTHY PIERCE has been Ethics Counsel for the State Bar of Wisconsin since 2004. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin–Madison and his law degree from the University of Wisconsin Law School. Mr. Pierce was previously a Deputy Director at the Office of Lawyer Regulation. He has also been employed as the Ethics Administrator for Milbank, Hadley, Tweed & McCloy, in New York, and as an Assistant State Public Defender in Racine. He is a frequent speaker on matters of professional ethics and teaches Professional Responsibility at the University of Wisconsin Law School.
