

**Glenn H. Yamahiro*****Candidate for Milwaukee County Circuit Court Branch 34***

Judge Glenn H. Yamahiro was appointed to the Circuit Court by Governor James Doyle in 2003. He was elected in 2004, re-elected in 2010 and 2016, and is unopposed in 2022. He is the first Asian-American judge in the history of the state of Wisconsin. He has served in homicide court, general felony, domestic violence court, drug treatment court, veteran's court, children's court, misdemeanor court, and small and large claims civil court. In 1999 he was appointed as a Judicial Court Commissioner where he served until his appointment to the circuit court. He began his career as an assistant public defender in the Milwaukee trial office before transitioning to private practice.

Judge Yamahiro served for several years as a faculty member of the Judicial Institute on Domestic Violence educating judges across the country under the auspices of the National Association of Juvenile and Family Court Judges. He has served on the boards of the Wisconsin Trust Account Foundation, the Access to Justice Commission, Beth el Ner Tamid Synagogue, and the Ovation Jewish Home and Care Center.

Judge Yamahiro is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin law school (1991) and received his undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire (1983) where he graduated with honors and received the Alumni Distinguished Achievement Award (2010).

Judge Yamahiro is married to Court Commissioner Isa Yamahiro and has two children, Hana and Enrique.
