You are hereby notified that the Court has issued the following order, which terminates and supersedes those portions of the Court's orders of May 22, 2020 regarding the filing of documents in the circuit courts and appellate courts during the COVID-19 pandemic:

WHEREAS the Supreme Court has administrative and superintending authority over the courts and judicial system of this state and a duty to promote the efficient and effective operation of the state's judicial system, Wis. Const. Art. VII, § 3; In re Kading, 70 Wis. 2d 508, 519-20, 235 N.W.2d 409 (1976); and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court issued a number of orders intended to minimize in-person filings and proceedings during the COVID-19 pandemic, including two May 22, 2020 orders<sup>1</sup> that extended an April 13, 2020 amended order entitled "In re the Matter of Filing of Court Documents in Circuit and Appellate Courts (Temporary Mailbox Rule)" for filings in both the circuit court and the appellate courts; and

WHEREAS, the number of newly confirmed cases of COVID-19 has decreased significantly as the number of vaccinated individuals has increased in Wisconsin, and the United

States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention declared on May 16, 2021, that "[f]ully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing," thereby causing the Court to re-examine the restrictions that the Court has previously placed on court proceedings, including appellate court operations, due to the pandemic; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to this court's administrative and superintending authority, the portions of this Court's May 22, 2020 orders extending the April 13, 2020 order "In re the Matter of Filing of Court Documents in Circuit and Appellate Courts (Temporary Mailbox Rule)" are hereby terminated for all circuit and appellate courts as of 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2021.
